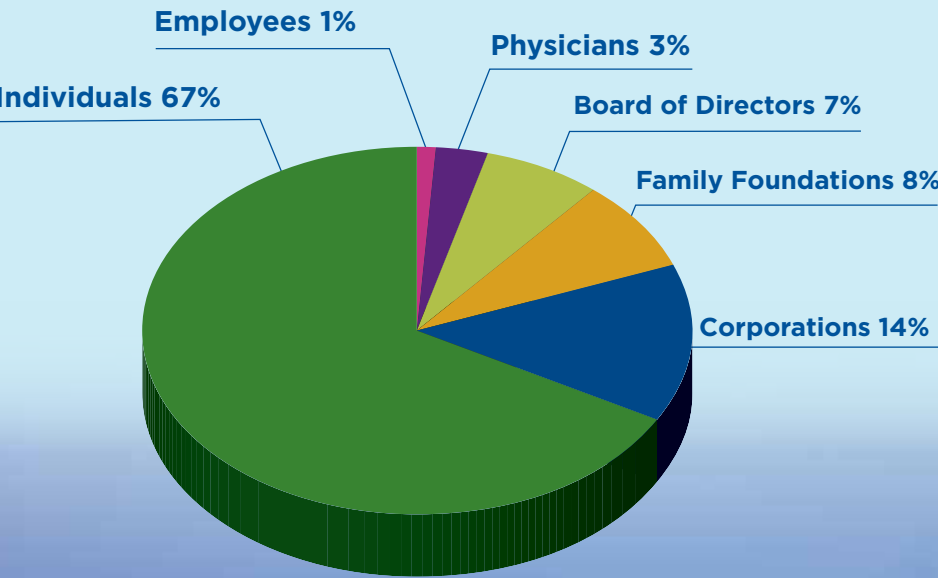

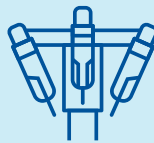

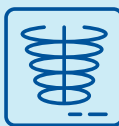

The Leonard's first gift to Mission Hospital was in May 1999; through a direct mail solicitation, they donated \$100 to support cancer programs and services. Over the past 15 years, Judi and Bill, and the Leonard Family Foundation, have made 24 individual gifts, generously supporting multiple events and campaigns.

## Expansion of Cancer Programs and Services

The Judi and Bill Leonard Institute for Cancer Prevention, Treatment and Wellness at Mission Hospital will establish a place of new possibilities, hope and healing in our community. Our comprehensive Leonard Cancer Institute will bring together specialists, clinical research and cutting-edge technology to compassionately care for the body, mind and spirit of our patients and family members.

Construction is underway for the new 4-story, 104,000 square-foot building, which will house radiation oncology, imaging services and medical oncology. Centralized in the building will be a comprehensive research and clinical trial program, as well as dedicated and specialized tumor boards. Working with experts across the country, we can

dramatically accelerate the pace of converting scientific discoveries into clinical advances that reduce the devastating effects of cancer.

A robust clinical nurse navigation program will provide stewardship and assistance for cancer patients and their families. Our programs will include varied menus of alternative and complementary therapies, programs and cancer education.

Mission will pair conventional treatments, such as surgery, radiation therapy and chemotherapy, with integrative medicine to create individualized, evidence-based cancer treatment programs.

These innovative treatments and therapies will be available in the new building in mid-2019.

Mission further developed our Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR) Program for the treatment of severe narrowing of the heart valves, which reduces blood flow to vital organs. TAVR is less invasive, allowing our patients to return to their normal activities more quickly with less discomfort.

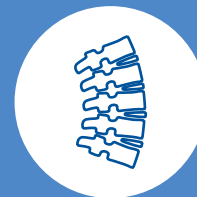

## Auxiliary of Mission Hospital Funds Serenity Room

One of the hospital's longstanding and most generous donor groups is our volunteer Auxiliary of Mission Hospital, comprised of 715 volunteers who work in 50 different hospital departments. Together, they donated more than 97,000 hours, the equivalent to 46.6 full-time employees, producing a value of \$2.76 million charitable service hours.

In December, the auxiliary completed their \$350,000 pledge to benefit the Mission Neuroscience Institute and committed \$250,000 to help create a Serenity Room.

Adjacent to the Emergency Department on the Mission Viejo campus, this dedicated

room will provide families with a private area to gather, receive critical updates and discuss medical issues with physicians.

Auxiliary member Cathy Hubbell and her husband, Richard, donated more than \$36,000 to purchase 14 transport wheelchairs frequently used by auxiliary members to transport our patients.

The auxiliary partnered with the foundation team to present our annual Light Up a Life tree lighting ceremony. This beloved celebration raised more than \$30,000 to enhance palliative care and hospice services at Mission Hospital.
