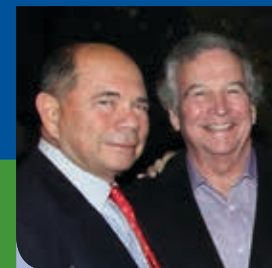
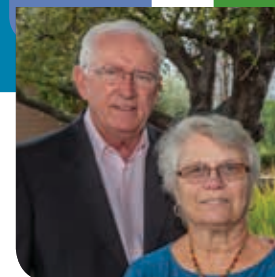

An Expression of Gratitude

Sarah never saw the truck that ran the red light and crashed into her car. In fact, she has little memory of the six weeks following the accident. Her husband, John remembers every moment of it, especially the phone call from Mission Hospital telling him that he needed to come to the hospital immediately.

"My heart just broke when I first saw her – she was lifeless, on a ventilator and hooked up to so many different monitors and tubes," remembers John. Her injuries were extensive. Her pelvis, both collarbones, a shoulder blade, and her leg were all broken. Sarah had difficulty breathing because her lung was punctured and six of her ribs were shattered, requiring titanium plates and screws to realign and bridge them together again.

"Sarah's care team was just extraordinary, seamlessly coordinating her care. They always respected her dignity and were so kind, so talented," recalls John. "Sarah had so many different specialists caring for her initially, I felt as though we were using every piece of technology and the expertise of every department in the hospital."

It was a long road to recovery, but Sarah was finally able to leave the Intensive Care Unit and then ultimately progressed to Mission's Acute Rehabilitation Unit. "The nurses were angels," shares John. "When Sarah arrived at the ARU, one of the nurses told me, 'We are here for Sarah and you. Day and night, we're here to provide whatever you need.' And they definitely did."

Every day Sarah got stronger and spent more time out of bed, walking and moving. Eventually she was able to go home.

That's when John and Sarah really started talking about how they could express their enormous gratitude to Mission Hospital and all her caregivers. They saved her life multiple times and restored her quality of life through their skill and dedication.

John and Sarah are now treasured members of our Summit Society and Guardian donor recognition group. We are honored by John and Sarah's generosity.

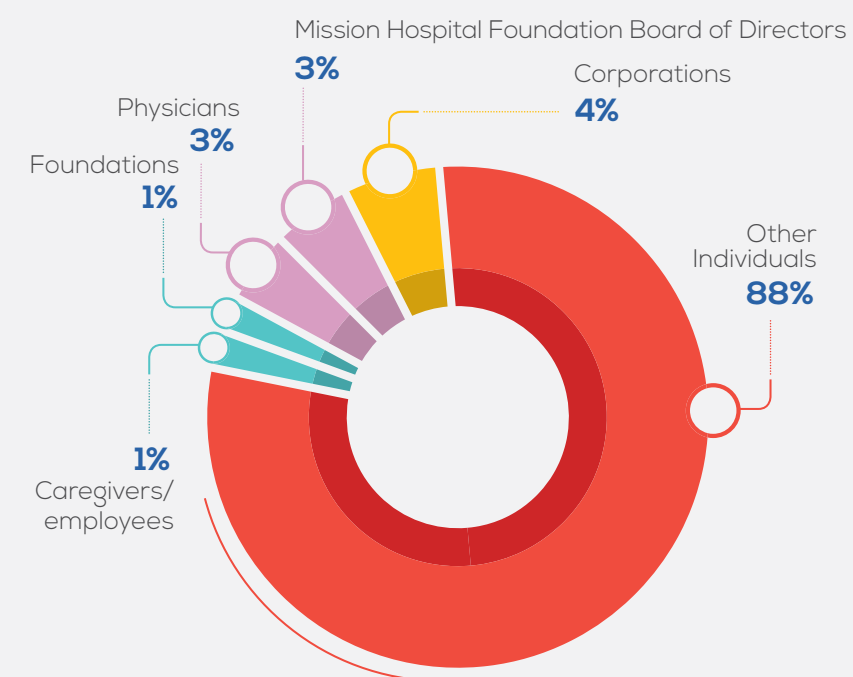

Blending Technology and Our Sacred Embrace

Each program and service in the Leonard Cancer Institute has been thoughtfully designed to be patient-focused, embracing our distinct commitment to compassionate care, innovative technology and advanced diagnostics. Here is a preview of a few of the features that make it so unique.

Patients will be guided throughout diagnosis and treatment toward wellness by a multi-disciplinary team of patient care navigators, comprised of nurses, genetic counselors, insurance and financial specialists, social workers, psychosocial providers, dietitians, fitness specialists and more.

Our dedicated clinical trials coordinator will partner with patients to identify research projects from our medical alliances across the country that match the patient's unique needs based on the specific tumor, cancer type and genetics.

A special teaching kitchen, supported by the McDermott family, inside the Leonard Cancer Institute, will enable our dietitians to offer cooking

demonstrations and serve delicious education. This kitchen will help to ensure that our patients receive the nourishment that is so incredibly important during and after treatment.

Our infusion patients will have the option of private treatment spaces or group areas that facilitate connections between patients.

Patients and families will find quiet sanctuaries throughout the building, places that promote healing and well-being, and artwork that offers inspiration and hope.

The Leonard Cancer Institute truly embodies our commitment to caring for our patients in body, mind and spirit.

Golf Classic Raises More Than \$500,000

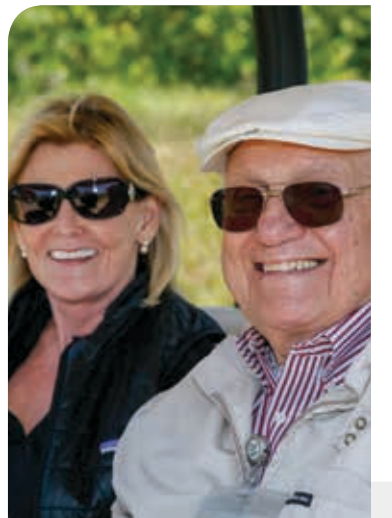

Our Dedicated Auxiliary

Since its founding in 1971, the auxiliary has raised more than \$2.3 million to support Mission's most critical projects. The auxiliary's current pledge of \$250,000 will help create a Tranquility Room adjacent to the Mission Viejo Emergency Department. This dedicated room will provide families with a private area to gather, receive critical updates and discuss medical issues with physicians. It speaks to our commitment to the values of dignity, compassion and excellence.

The auxiliary once again partnered with the foundation to present our annual Light Up a Life tree lighting ceremony. Nearly 200 people were

honored and more than \$30,000 was raised to support palliative and hospice services at Mission. This year, Spiritual Care's annual memorial service was integrated into the event, and this partnership will be our model moving forward.
